Twelve Lighthouses is an illuminated installation composed of twelve distinct structures, each varying in size and brightness, spread across a vast open space, because everyone's sense of safety is different. Some feel protected under a table, others in the stillness of a closed room. Some are drawn to a soft, quiet glow, while others need a light that shines boldly. This work invites visitors to wander, to pause, and to find the lighthouse that feels most suitable to them, offering a moment to breathe, to feel, and maybe, to begin again.

The installation expands upon an earlier piece: a glowing outline of a house that stood as both beacon and sanctuary. It represented the idea of a safe place, not necessarily one we come from, but one we can step into.

For those whose childhood homes were marked by chaos, fear, or the absence of protection, this structure offered a reimagined portal, one held together by light.

Though transparent, the houses are defined by radiant lines. Here, light becomes both boundary and shield. It repels darkness and the weight of the past, making space for whatever you carry.

Now you meet twelve lighthouses, each here to help you feel at home. A real home.

Take your time.

Feel each one.

And find the light where you can finally breathe deep.
